PARKING REGULATIONS

DO YOU KNOW THE RULES...

Parkeringskontrol Nord will contribute to the towns remaining a pleasant place in which to travel – for pedestrians and cyclists as well.

This means, for example, that motorists must comply with the parking regulations!

It is your responsibility to keep up to date with The Danish Road Traffic Act, including the applicable rules for parking.

Below we offer you a little guidance on some of the parking regulations that most often confuse motorists.

WAITING AND PARKING



Sign C61

»Waiting prohibited«
You may not wait here at all, not even to only "unload" a passenger!



Sign C62

»Parking prohibited«
You may not park here. However, you may wait here for up to 3 minutes. The loading and unloading of both goods and passengers are permitted.

REMEMBER THE ADDITIONAL INFORMATION SIGNS...

Example 1
Prohibitions on waiting apply to both directions of traffic.

Example 2
You may wait but may not park in the *opposite lane*, facing the oncoming traffic.
Facing forward, you may park up to 30 minutes within the stated period of time.

ZONE SIGNS

»Parking prohibited«
You may not park within the entire zone. It may be a continuous area such as a square or the like. The prohibition on parking applies throughout the entire zone when you pass a zone sign (e.g. E68) upon entering and until you pass a zone sign (e.g. E69) indicating deregulation upon exiting.

»Play/recreation area«
Parking in this zone is absolutely prohibited for cars except in specially marked areas. The prohibition does not apply to bicycles, mopeds or two-wheel motorcycles.

P-DISC AND P-TICKET



P-disc

P-disc
In zones where there is a sign indicating restricted parking and there is no ticket machine, you must use a P-disc. There must only be one P-disc, which must be displayed through the windscreen. It must have a pointer, which must be set at the *start* of the parking period.



P-ticket

P-ticket
In zones where a ticket machine is operating, you must place the ticket so that it is visible through the windscreen. Do not forget that the ticket can be blown off when you close the car door, or if you have a window slightly open.

PARKING AND THE KERB...



Prohibited!

Kerb parking....
Certainly does not mean that the car is parked up on the kerb. You absolutely may not either wait or park – partly or completely – on pavements or in squares, except within specially marked areas.
